A flashback is a literary device in which an earlier event is inserted into the normal chronological order of a narrative.

Flashbacks can occur in the form of narration, dreams, memories, etc. They can provide insight into a character's behaviour and attitude; can give insight into current conflicts or can add depth to the plot.
